Getting here

We're located just an hour and 15 minutes west of Melbourne.

From Melbourne

Driving

Take the 110km journey along the Western Freeway (M8).

Train

Direct from Melbourne's Southern Cross station, swipe your Myki to arrive in less than 90 minutes on the direct V/Line train at the 19th century-built Railway Station right in the centre of town.

Airport

The road trip from Tullamarine or Avalon airports to Ballarat takes about one hour. Options to get you here direct from the airport include hiring a car, or booking the Airport Shuttlebus which departs from Tullamarine.

First stop

Visitor Information Centre

Located in the historic Town Hall, in the heart of the CBD. This is a terrific info stop when you arrive in Ballarat. You can nab local knowledge from the locals themselves, including advice on attractions, local transport, maps, guided tour options and suggested itineraries for your stay.

**1 For craft beer:
Red Duck Brewery.**

“I love the experimental nature of the Red Duck team. They always have new beers that are really interesting. They understand seasonality and are always looking for new styles, bottles and ingredients to complement the next brew.”



**2 For a unique dining experience:
The Forge Pizzeria.**

“I probably need to declare my bias having worked at The Forge for two years, but it is one of Ballarat’s most delicious and consistent dining experiences. It ticks a lot of boxes – atmosphere, service, craft beer, good regional wine list – and as a dad with young children, it’s family friendly and the pizza is brilliant.”

**3 For a local producer:
Inglenook Dairy.**

“The major reason for me coming back to Ballarat to live and work was the produce of the region. We are smack-bang in the middle of the food belt here, and we’ve got the advantage of all these fantastic producers right on our doorstep.

“In a tough time for dairy farmers, Inglenook have created a business that delivers a great product that is a true taste of our region. I’m excited to hear there are more products to be released in the not too distant future as well.”



**4 For local wine: Warrenmang
Estate’s Black Puma Shiraz.**

“My first fine wine experience as a teenager back in the late 1990s was at Warrenmang Estate. We did a tasting at the cellar door with Luigi Bazzani and I tried Black Puma for the first time. It was probably the first time I had been exposed to a wine of this calibre. I still remember Luigi talking about how the climate affects the size and intensity of the grapes used to make Black Puma and the selection process of each vintage, and while walking through the barrel room underground it gave this experience a context that made it all the more special.”

**5 For the best
coffee in town:
Kittlety’s.**

“Kittlety’s is a great little spot on Ballarat’s grandest old street, and it’s been made to feel very homely with the décor and delicious food. I love Hellbilly Roasting coffee (at Kittlety’s), it’s blended locally and carefully from beans sourced from all over the globe to create a unique flavour profile.”



**6 For a fresh
produce market:
Talbot Market.**

“When you see what’s on offer each time you go to the Talbot Market, it shows just how many passionate small producers there are in western Victoria. It always seems to draw a good crowd.”

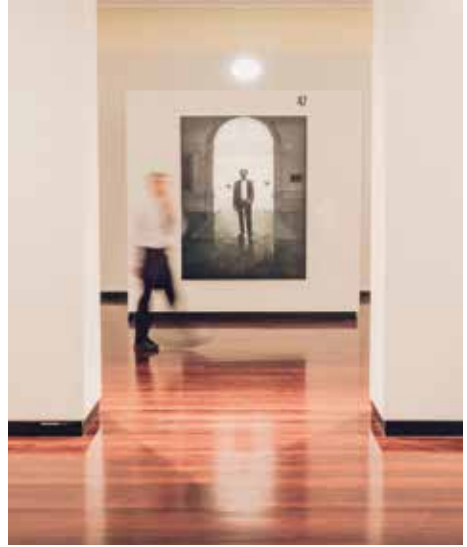

2 For craft beer: Athletic Club Brewery.

"They brew their own beer, allow you to taste beer, make your own beer, have functions and it's a great place to relax especially in summer. When I go here I like to relax and sink a Eureka Red IPA."



3 For nature: Lake Wendouree.

"The Lake is a place of contemplation and natural beauty. The old trees that surround it and the small bird habitats create a positive eco-system that is a visual delight. Watching the native birds fly over the lake during sunset is a sight everyone should experience and I often symbolise this in my artworks."



4 For dinner: Meigas.

"Meigas is the best Spanish restaurant I have ever eaten at and by far one of the most popular places to dine out in Ballarat. The best experience would be to go with a group of people for dinner and select the Feed Me option where the chef will cook you delicious serves of food until you are full."

5 For your coffee: The Local café.

"It's my go-to coffee spot. It's cosy, the coffee is brilliant and it has a really awesome atmosphere."



6 For a great night out: Karova Lounge.

"Karova Lounge is hands-down the best place to go out in Ballarat for great live entertainment. This intimate venue makes watching the live band an up-close-and-personal experience. Karova's open and relaxed atmosphere means every one of all different ages feel welcomed and can have a good time."



Ballarat Botanical Gardens:

Top 5 fun facts

1. It used to be a police horse paddock

Before the discovery of gold in the 1850s, Ballarat was an isolated squatter settlement, and the Botanical Gardens were used as the Police Horse Paddock.

2. The fernery is more than 100 years old

Remnant footings from the 1880s still remain exposed in the gardens west of the current fernery (which will soon be undergoing a redevelopment).

3. It was once home to the Ballarat Zoo

Nursery Drive and Zoo Drive in the gardens are a legacy to this zoo which was there from 1917 to 1959. You will still see some of the historic concrete structures from the 1940s which are the leftovers of the animal enclosures.

4. It features Australia's only avenue of Prime Minister busts

The Prime Ministers Avenue is a feature of national significance. It is a collection of bronze Prime Minister portraits mounted on polished granite pedestals and housed along the magnificent Horse Chestnut Avenue of the gardens.

5. It houses a large selection of authentic Italian statues

Wealthy Ballarat citizen Thomas Stoddart bought 12 marble statues during a visit to Carrara in Italy in the 1880s and gave them, together with Sicilian marble pedestals, to the citizens of Ballarat.

Sovereign Hill

The multi award-winning Sovereign Hill is an outdoor living museum set across 64 acres of hillside on the edge of town. Here you'll find all the action and excitement of the 1850s Gold Rush, depicted with an extraordinary attention to detail. You'll be swept up in the hustle and bustle of Main Street, where costumed ladies and gents parade their new-found wealth and Redcoat Soldiers fire their rifles. Discover shops selling 1850s-style goods including the museum's iconic Raspberry Drops and assorted boiled lollies. There's hotels and schools to visit, a theatre with goldfields entertainment, century-old photographic opportunities and a plethora of activity to be discovered. See a spectacular \$150,000 gold pour, ride in a horsedrawn carriage and – if you're feeling particularly adventurous – find out what it was like to work in an underground mine as you head below the surface on an inclined tramway ride. For anyone interested in trades, you'll be fascinated to watch blacksmiths, coachbuilders, wheelwrights, confectioners and candlemakers, and chat to them about their work. Pan for gold yourself – and keep what you find. During winter, watch in awe as the museum comes to life as part of the spectacular Christmas in July: Winter Wonderlights display. Smell the sweet scent of Christmas spices as they fill the air, enjoy the sound of traditional carols, and glory in the faux snow as it falls at regular intervals. By night, watch as the Main Street comes to life in spectacular style with magical yuletide projections. Wheelchair accessible.

The Pyrenees Wine Region, about half an hour outside Ballarat, is the sort of place you can drop in to for a couple of days or quite happily potter around for a week – however long you manage to stretch your trip out for, you can't really help but have more than your fair share of delicious food and locally produced wine.

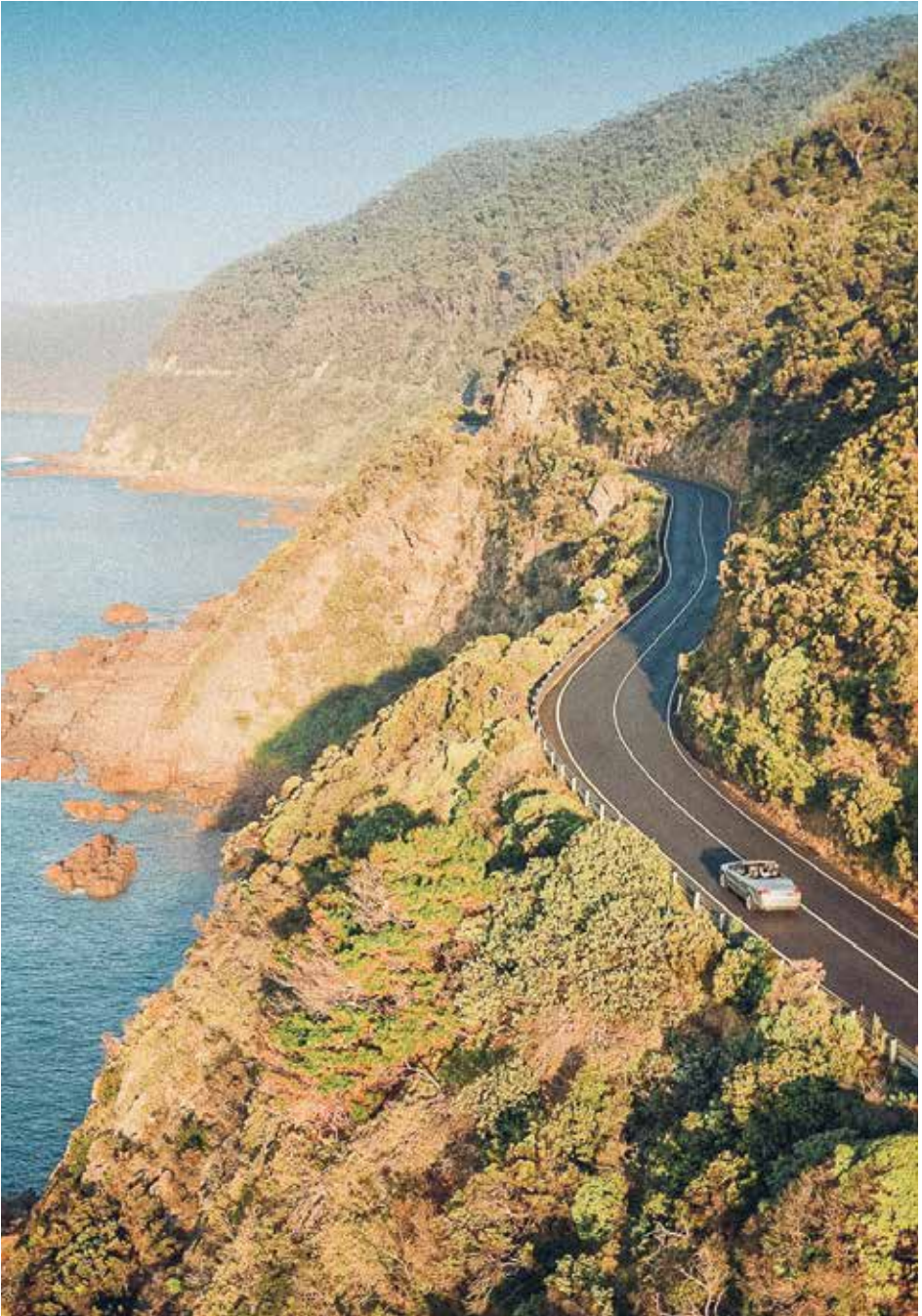

It's hard to imagine now, but in 1850 there were eight hotels, a five-storey bluestone flourmill, butter factory and several banks in Smeaton. Some things don't change, and there is still a lot to do in Smeaton, Blampied and surrounds to keep you going for a long while.

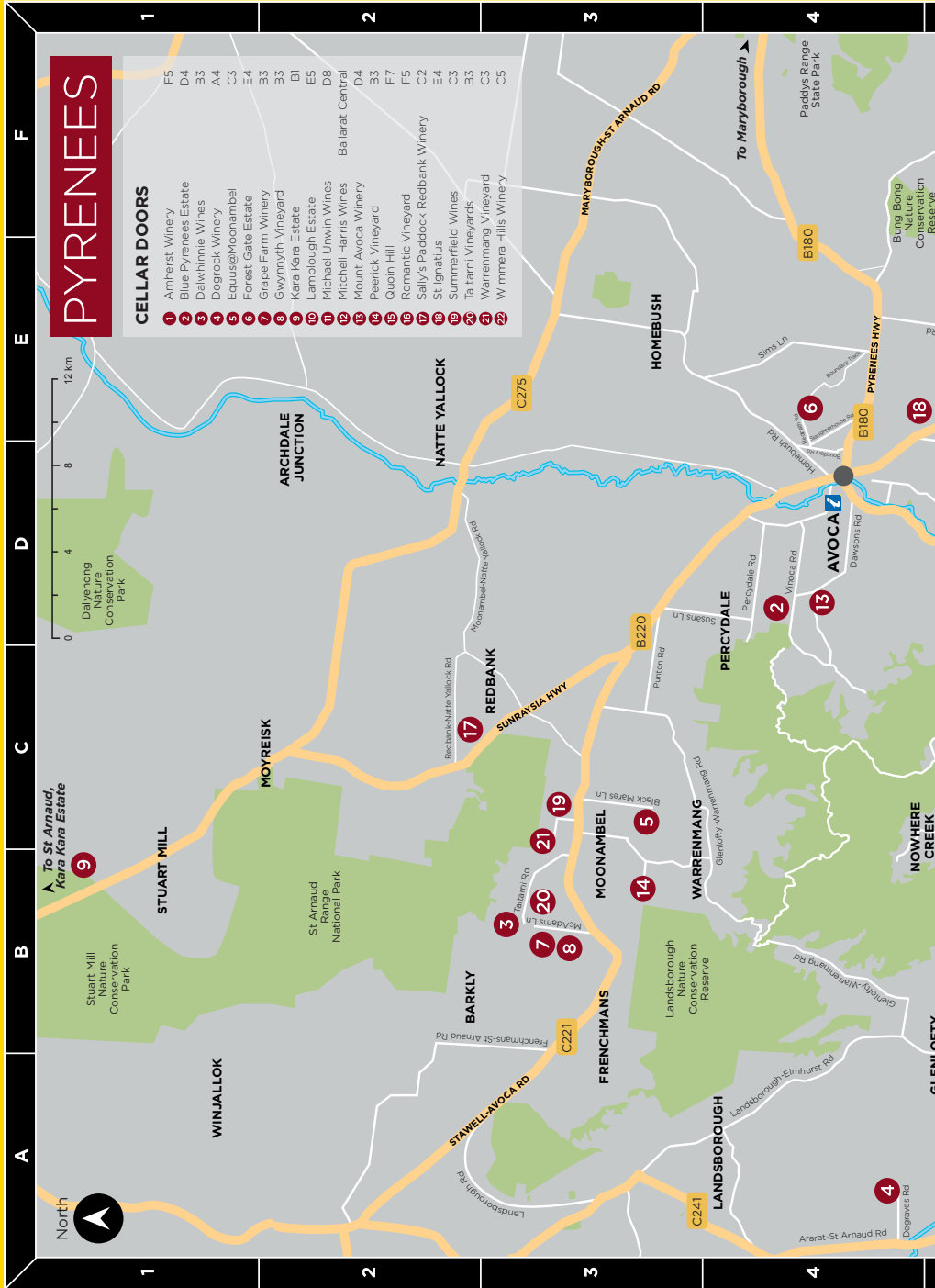
